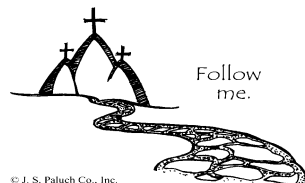

Meets every Wednesday, 8:45am, in the Jubilee Room. Everyone is welcome.

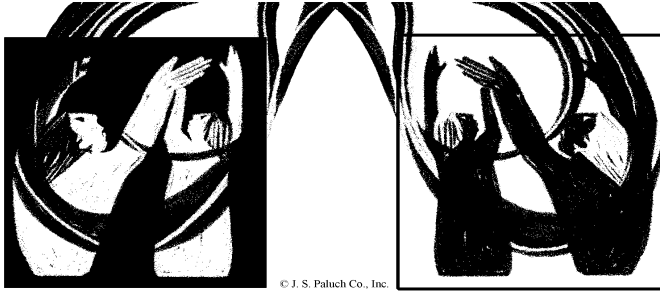

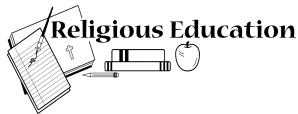
